Dear Doctor:-

I notice by the recent newspaper reports that there will be substantial additions made to the R. C. School at Cluny on the Blackfoot Reserve and also that there probably will be some houses built at ~~Cluny~~ ^{Gaichen} for some of the agency staff .

I wish to call your attention to the fact that we handle the Iron Fireman stoker and we respectfully wish to point out that it would be greatly appreciated if these stokers can be specified in these buildings. As I pointed out to you last year the fuel saving is enormous and the convenience afforded the householder is greater than anything obtainable in any other method . Kindly advise me at your earliest convenience if we may expect to supply our stoker in the above proposed buildings . We have one of our machines in the administration buildings at Banff and if you will refer to Mr Wardell of the Dominion Parks Dept he will give you first hand information as to

I beg to refer you to my report on the Crowfoot School, and I wish to herewith enumerate the repairs required at this institution: As the Department know, we have been waiting for several years for an addition to the school but as there is apparently no hope of this a great many repairs will have to be carried out.

- 1.- Girls' playroom: Floor badly worn; size of room: 30' x 30'.
- 2.- Girls' dormitory: Floor in very bad shape; size of room: 30' x 30'
- 3.- Plaster throughout building and in basement requires patching; Cement floor in basement badly broken in places.
- 4.- East and West Porches: Floor needs renewing: Size 12' x 10'; Steps on both sides also need renewing: 8 steps 12' x 12"; Porch on South side, floor and steps need renewing: Size of porch - 90' x 10'; Steps - 5' x 12".
- 5.- Screen windows, all full-size: Wire has pulled away from the sides and is badly broken, and a great deal of wire netting will have to be renewed. This is the work of a carpenter.
- 6.- Eaves-troughing: On the South side of the building this needs renewing as when the rain comes from the South or West it does considerable damage to the building in its present state.
- 7.- School roof needs painting and patching; also the trim around windows, eaves, &c.
- 8.- The barn needs painting.
- 9.- For the laundry they have asked for a mangle and a tumbler dryer.
- 10.- Twelve (12) chairs for the sisters' recreation room. Those now in use are in poor shape and I would ask that this be allowed.





I have your 401-11A. R.C. of the 12th instant, enumerating the repairs required at the Crowfoot Indian Residential School.

In this connection I have to say that funds, to the amount of approximately \$500.00, are available for repairs at this school. The Department will approve of carrying out the work as enumerated in the first five items mentioned in your letter. You should arrange for the purchase of the materials required, from firms on the approved list. The Honourable the Minister has directed that, for any building to be done on the Blackfoot Reserve, the following building contractors and carpenters should be given an opportunity to do the work:-

and the following located at Gleichen, Alta.:-


east and west porches; and renewing wire screens in windows, can be completed for the amount available and, if possible, at less cost.

Regarding the painting of the barns, I would say that, if the above authorized work does not exceed the amount of approximately \$500.00, the Department would approve of the purchase of the quantity of paint required for the barn, provided the school authorities can assist with the labour.

You may arrange for the purchase of 12 chairs for the Sisters' recreation room - these to be obtained from firms on the approved list.

After the above authorized work has been completed, please forward itemized accounts, in triplicate, stating in detail the work done, and accounts, in triplicate, for the labour, showing the number of days or hours employed and the rate paid.

The Department will be unable to consider the repairs to the eaves troughing and school roof and supplying paint for interior decorating. There will be no funds available to supply a mangle and a drier for the laundry.

Re St. Joseph's School
Blackfoot Reserve, Cluny, Alta.

This school has been on the Government list for enlargement for some time. It is very much overcrowded, and Father Rioult and the Sisters have repeatedly been asking for the building to be enlarged to accommodate the increased number of pupils who are in residence.

It was understood that this work would be done this summer, and apparently the Blackfoot Indian Reserve has some funds available for this purpose. The area between Cluny and Gleichen was totally hilled out last year, with the result that a large number of people are in distressed circumstances.

The extension of this school would mean a great ^{deal} to this district and to the Indians if the work were done this year and the year after.

I am sure that if you would take this matter up with the Indian Department, you would be able to very materially help us in this matter.

MEMORANDUM:

The Honourable the Superintendent General,-

I have Mr. Jackson's memorandum of the 19th instant, with copy attached of a communication to Senator Buchanan, from David Nelson, of Cluny, Alberta, regarding the erection of an extension to the present building at the Crowfoot Indian Residential School, on the Blackfoot Reserve, to provide increased accommodation.

As you are, no doubt, aware, this matter received attention at the time our Estimates were being prepared for the current fiscal year. Further, an effort was made to have the funds required for the purpose included in the special vote allowed this Department to construct a number of school buildings. The amount required to erect the addition, viz.: \$50,000.00, was not allowed.

Mr. Inspector Christianson, Calgary, is being written, with the request that he consult the Indians of the Blackfoot Band and endeavour to obtain their consent to provide the amount required, viz.: \$50,000.00, from the Interest Funds at the credit of the Band in the Department. If the Indians refuse their consent, there is no other source from which funds would be available to carry out the work in erecting the extension to the Crowfoot Indian Residential School during the present fiscal year.

Dear Sir:

I have your 401-11A. R.C. of the 22nd instant, in connection with repairs to the Crowfoot Indian Residential School and the funds available for the painting of the barn. In this regard I would refer you to official letter of the 17th instant, in which you were informed that only the sum of \$500 was available for repairs at this school and the work to be carried out was enumerated.

In the letter referred to, you were informed regarding the painting of the barn, that, if the repairs authorized did not exceed the amount of the appropriation - \$500.00, the Department would approve the purchase of the quantity of paint required for the barn, provided the school authorities could assist with the labour. It is considered that the cost of the repairs authorized might not use up the entire amount available and that there would be sufficient funds remaining to purchase the quantity of paint required for the barn.

The Department will leave the matter of the repairs in your hands, to carry out the work you consider most urgent for the funds available, and you may utilize the sum of approximately \$500 in the manner in which you consider most advantageous in the interests of the school. If you believe it would be better to expend some of the funds available for interior decorating, rather than any of the other work enumerated by you in the first five items of your letter of the 12th instant, you may do so. However, I would request that you keep the total expenses as close as possible to the amount available, viz.: \$500.





I am afraid, I have overlooked to make the application last year and our Indian Agent is unable to find any authority for this expenditure I have had the Night Watchman since the 1st of September 1936 and intend to keep him until July the 1st 1937. I am always afraid of a fire in this old frame building. Kindly advise me on the Department's views on this matter.

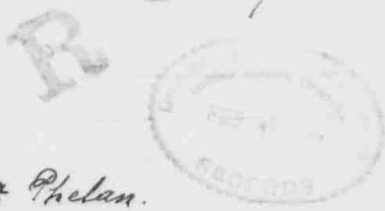

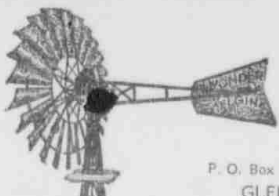



For the past two or three years, the Department has been endeavouring to secure funds to make necessary alterations at the Crowfoot Indian Residential School, in order to provide adequate accommodation for the number of pupils that could be enrolled at this school. The estimate of the cost of the repairs that we have received was, approximately, \$50,000.

I regret that it was not possible to provide this amount in the current year's appropriation, but a much smaller amount might be made available and, for this reason, you are being written with a view to obtaining your opinion of the suggestion offered in this letter.

Inspector Schmidt is being requested to visit your agency in the very near future and, when he does so, you should visit the Crowfoot School and discuss with the Principal the advisability of erecting either of the following buildings:-

- (a) A two-roomed building with full basement - This would provide two classrooms and the basement would be intended for vocational training.



- (b) A four-roomed building with full basement - This would provide three classrooms, a room for sewing and, in this case also, the basement could be used for vocational training.

Either of the above buildings would have to be erected at a short distance from the present school. The erection of either building would make more room available in the main building for dormitories.

When you have discussed this matter thoroughly, you should advise the Department and, at the same time, you should give an estimate of the cost of both buildings. You should, also, state if, in the event of the Department proceeding with the work, it could be done by day labour, employing Indians under the charge of a competent foreman or whether you consider it would be cheaper to let the work be done by contract.

SCHOOLS

I made very short visits to the schools this month. Pupils did not have holidays at Easter but got three days when interest payment was made on the 15th & 16th. All pupils look well. The school farms and gardens are being seeded and work is being done very well. Some handicraft work has been started and Coronation Programmes are being prepared. The Principal at Crowfoot School wants more land, a problem to be considered and one which is not easy because Indian farmers are close neighbours and have valuable buildings on the land which the school desires. However, I believe there is a solution.

The Old Sun school is not so situated; unoccupied land near the school and in the flats where irrigation is possible is now capable of intensive production of feed and garden crops for this institution. This year, I expect that Old Sun's will grow all vegetables and feed required. Formerly this was impossible on dry lands.

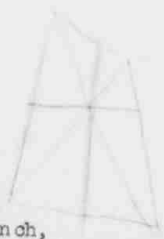

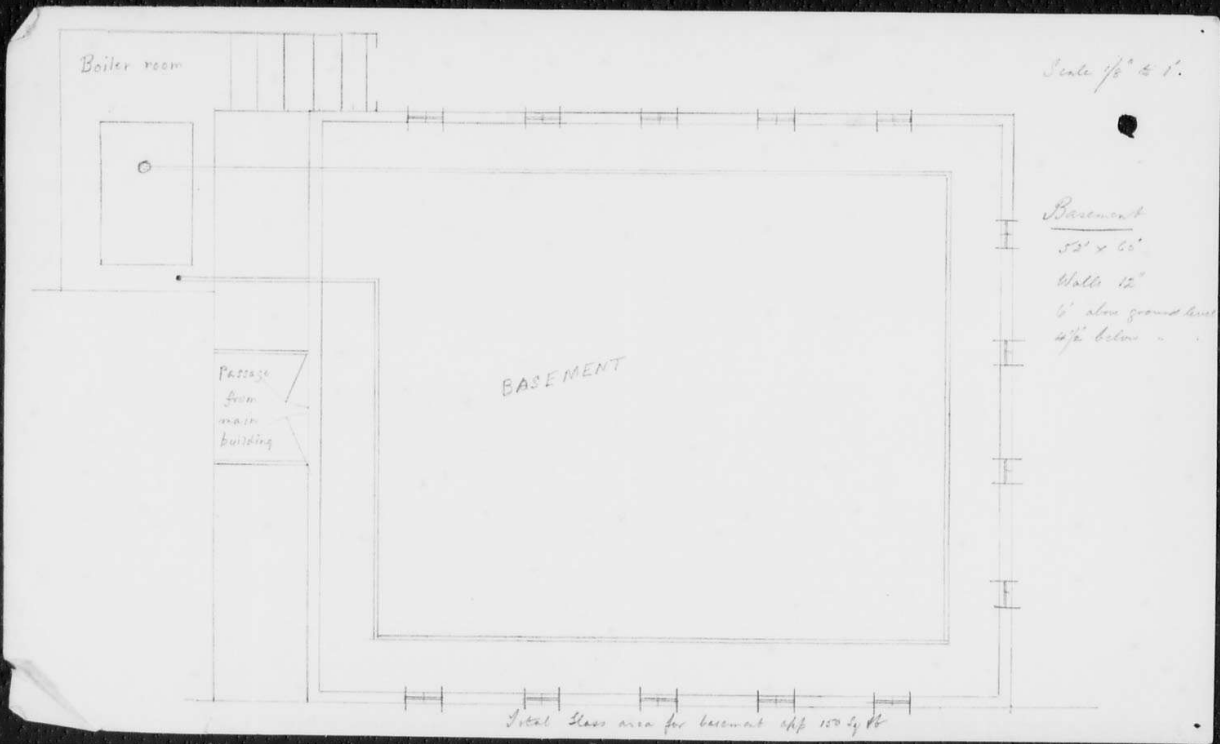

Dear Sir:-

Further to my letter of May 20th last regarding the erection of a building to relieve the overcrowded condition at the Crowfoot Residential School on this Reserve. I am now in a position to report our findings.

Inspector C.P. Schmidt spent a greater part of the 3rd instant with me at the school where alternative plans were considered. At the outset we agreed that a two-roomed building would not answer the purpose. There are 82 pupils on the roll and the Assistant Principal estimates that there may be at least 140 pupils by 1943. Whether or not his computation is actuarially correct matters but little. We do realize that there is a definite increase from year to year and we must build to take care of the increase over a period of years, if the existing system is likely to continue. There are now three classes and as the number of pupils increases, a fourth class must be started. Therefore the building should have 4 class rooms and should be large enough to accommodate 140 to 150 pupils. That is Inspector Schmidt's definite conviction. Originally, I had rough plans prepared for an entirely separate building but we immediately ran into opposition from the Principal and the Sister Superior. We then surveyed the possibility of connecting with the main building and attached rough plans will indicate what is suggested.

The central heating plant is certainly an advantage and we understand that the boiler is capable of heating, not only the basement and class rooms but could also heat a second storey if this was desired at some future time. The Principal wants the addition despite the fact that certain light and possibly ventilation is taken from the present building. The rooms affected are either store rooms or staff rooms and occupied only a few hours each day. He and the Sister want the addition so connected with the main building that pupils may get back & forward in all kinds of weather without added clothing. Another reason for an addition and an important one, is the hope and desire to have a second storey at some future date, to be used as a chapel. The basement of the addition would be used for vocational training and a boys' playroom; there is room for both. In fact, such an addition as is suggested would leave three class rooms and a large playroom on the ground floor for other use which is much needed. You realize, of course that a 80 pupil school is housing 80 odd pupils and increased staff and overcrowding is terrible.

The addition recommended would be 52' x 60' with passages continued from basement to basement and ground floor to class rooms through a glassed in passage way on the existing verandah, and would be frame construction with a ledge left for brick veneer. The foundation and footings would be strong enough to carry a second storey and the roof would be flat tar & gravel.

You will note that a 10' passage runs down the centre of the addition, with the end room walled off beyond the doors to the two south class rooms. In fact, this is a room which would disappear if folding doors were constructed to turn it and the class rooms into one large auditorium. An auditorium is a crying need at this institution and we know no better way to supply an excellent one. The small room at the end of the hall is, by the way, an idea of Inspector Schmidt's. He knows the need of such as a quiet music room for the Sisters.

In arriving at the estimate of cost, I secured the technical advice of a representative of the Crown Lumber Co., L. Michael, Local steamfitter, and the Calgary Manager of the Dunham Heating System; also a local electrician. The heating main from the boiler is estimated large enough to heat a second storey and the general heating system to take care of class rooms where there is extra glass space. We have followed recognized school plans. We have not indicated emergency exits from the addition. We realize these must be supplied but our submission is a rough plan of our ideas.

The estimated cost, if done under contract, is \$12,500.00. It cannot be done by day labour employing Indians, nor would I recommend day labour with a white crew. Bitter experience has shewn us that this is a very expensive way to construct a building. We haven't a copy of the plan of the main building here but the basement and ground floor must conform to it. As a matter of fact, the basement is high - 6' above ground and 4'8" below, while the studding is, we believe, 14'. This means big airy rooms and basement. We hope the addition is not larger than anticipated; we started with plans of much smaller buildings and had to keep on enlarging until nearly double the size and cost that I originally submitted for the consideration of the Inspector and the Principal. But there was no alternative if the Department is building with any long term vision but to supply something along the line suggested here. I trust with the assistance of Mr Christianson and others who know Crowfoot School, you will be able to get a mental picture of our idea.

I enclose letter from Right Reverend F. P. Carroll, Bishop of Calgary, which was forwarded to me under cover of Mr. Pratt's memorandum of June 17th.

The information contained in the Bishop's letter regarding the condition at the Crowfoot Indian Residential School is correct. For the past three years, an endeavour has been made to secure the funds that are required to increase the accommodation at this school, as it is not only overcrowded at the present time but information that has been forwarded to us indicates that the number of children requiring education will increase during the next few years.

When preparing our Estimates for the current fiscal year, an amount of \$50,000 was included in order that a proper and adequate building could be added to the Crowfoot School. However, this amount did not finally remain in our Main Appropriation and, when preparing the Special Supplementaries, it was again requested but not allowed.

Recently, Inspector Schmidt and Indian Agent Gooderham visited the Crowfoot Residential School and, while they consider a large addition necessary, they

now advise that, if an addition estimated to cost \$12,500 could be erected this year, the present overcrowding could be temporarily alleviated.

I enclose letter from Right Reverend F. P. Carroll, Bishop of Calgary, which was forwarded to me under cover of Mr. Pratt's memorandum of June 17th.

The information contained in the Bishop's letter regarding the condition at the Crowfoot Indian Residential School is correct. For the past three years, an endeavour has been made to secure the funds that are required to increase the accommodation at this school, as it is not only overcrowded at the present time but information that has been forwarded to us indicates that the number of children requiring education will increase during the next few years.


When preparing our Estimates for the current fiscal year, an amount of \$50,000 was included in order that a proper and adequate building could be added to the Crowfoot School. However, this amount did not finally remain in our Main Appropriation and, when preparing the Special Supplementaries, it was again requested but not allowed.

Recently, Inspector Schmidt and Indian Agent Gooderham visited the Crowfoot Residential School and, while they consider a large addition necessary, they

Dear Sir,-

The Department received your letter of June 4th, with reference to the Crowfoot Indian Residential School.

Very careful consideration has been given to the proposed erection of the building that you suggest and, in this connection, it is noted that your letter mentioned an amount of \$12,500 as the cost of the addition. It is presumed that this only provided for an unfinished building. The Department feels, however, that it would be inadvisable to build an addition and leave it in such condition.

The funds at our disposal are so limited that it is not possible to provide the amount that would be necessary to erect a completed addition of the size suggested in your letter. Past experience shows that it costs approximately 25¢ a cubic foot to erect a completed building. Under these circumstances, it is found that funds could be secured for a completed building, 50 feet by 37 feet, with basement and one floor. This would give considerable extra space but would only be slightly more than one-half the size of the building suggested in your letter. However, in view of lack of funds, it is all that we can consider this year.

I would appreciate your immediately discussing our proposal with the Principal and advise me, by wire, if he concurs in the erection of the addition which we suggest. If so, arrangements will be made to proceed with the work.

SCHOOLS

All children were on holidays but a few T.B.'s. and some older girls who remained at school till after Calgary Stampede. Gardens at both schools are irrigated and are good. Old Sun school has a good fodder crop under irrigation. At Crowfoot grain crops were poor and are out for feed; the Principal augmented this by purchasing between 30 and 40 tons of prairie hay and wheat hay from Indians. We allowed this to co-operate, but God Knows, every ton offered is needed and then it will cost \$10.00 to \$15.00 per ton for extra feed for Indian stock. The well at Old Suns was inspected again by an engineer of our Department. The water level is dropping and an auxillary well is needed, I believe. The basement of this school is being repaired. The Chief's are prepared to supply nurses at the schools for the year 1937-38 on condition that they have T.B. experience, are recommended by the Medical Branch and follow the instructions of the Medical Superintendent; all of which is reasonable, I think. The time is near at hand when this should become a Departmental and not a Band obligation.





Early in September Mr. Hoey asked Mr. Dudley of our Architectural Staff to prepare plans and specifications for an addition to the above school based on a drawing submitted by the Principal and which showed a four-room addition. Rough sketch plans were prepared on this basis but it is found that a four-classroom school conforming to the existing building cannot be constructed for the amount available, namely, \$12,500. It is now understood, however, that the Indian Agent has wired you that three classrooms only are required. This will mean a complete revision of the preliminary drawings that have been recently prepared.

Would you kindly advise me if we should provide for four rooms or three rooms, and if the former, would another \$2,000 be available.

In view of the late date this addition was decided upon, it is doubtful if work could be proceeded with economically by the time the plans are ready.



I beg to submit to you remarks concerning the proposed extension to the Crowfoot Indian Residential School. Of course these remarks should have been submitted to you before today, but we were not consulted about the plans officially and no blue prints were communicated to us.

The schools have been built for the accommodation of the pupils and staff; the Indian Department has in the past, been very well disposed to give us conveniences as needed, and I am very thankful for this.

On June 3rd, Mr. C.F. Schmidt, Inspector of Indian Affairs, with Mr. Gooderham, our Indian Agent, inspected the School in view of finding the most suitable place for the proposed extension, and after having through the school building in order to determine other alterations necessitated by this new addition, we came to the conclusion that the only place for the extension was the south side of the building and this also is the unanimous opinion of all contractors who have come to make their estimates before sending their tenders to Ottawa.

On the west side the main difficulty is the heating problem, not only for the initial cost of carrying a main to such a distance from the boiler; in fact we already have a great problem on hand in trying to heat the west side of the actual building, exposed as it is to all winter winds. On the east side, we run into the pressure tank, the cistern and the pipe running from the flowing well into the cistern. And on both sides the building will take up the play ground space of the children; in fact on the west side it would entirely do away with the girls' playground which is already very small.

Also if the actual plans for the addition are kept, only the south side of the building would furnish adequate light for the basement class rooms. The actual ice-house will be torn down in any case as it was never satisfactory and is now useless since a frigidaire has been installed in the building itself.

When your Department first consulted the Indian Agent about plans for the new addition, we were glad that an open basement had been provided for vocational training, and in which a dairy room would have been installed, as the actual room in the building used for such purpose is to be used to enlarge the dining-room. In this open basement a carpenter's shop for the boys and a room for Indian work had been proposed by us and accepted by the Indian Agent. However on the new plans, there is no more possibility of doing such a thing, as two class-rooms are located in the basement.

I submit these remarks to your Department in the hopes that they will be taken into consideration before the contract is definitely given. Thanking you for all the trouble you have taken and the interest you have shown in approving an addition to our School. I remain,

Both schools were inspected. Class/^{room}work O.K. and general conditions satisfactory. Pupils at Old Sun might have been more tidy and cleaner but a number of changes in staff disorganizes a big institution. A nurse arrived on the 30th for Old Suns. A good flow of water was obtained at 185 feet in drilling at this school. At Crowfoot, girls downstairs were much overcrowded but now that an addition is to be erected, many of the housing troubles should disappear. Both schools threshed crops which totaled near 2500 bus. of all kinds of grain.

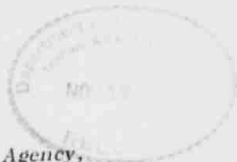



I beg to draw to your attention at this time to the fire escapes at the Crowfoot Residential School.

There are two iron poles set in concrete on the West and East wings of this institution and a wooden stairway at the rear. The iron poles lead to senior dormitories and access to them is through windows. Access to the wooden stairway is by door from junior ~~class room~~ dormitories.

In a fire drill last term, one of the sisters broke a bone in her foot which will give you some idea how dangerous the iron pole escape is. Everybody must climb over a bed onto the window sill and then slide down to the cement base.

During the past summer I saw a simple shute escape on a Municipal Hospital and it appealed to me. The shute which was frame construction covered with thin sheet iron. There was a landing at the top and bottom and access to the top landing was by a door. The door could be equipped with a theatre escape fixture, so that there would be no delay in getting it open. Escapes by the windows should be replaced by doors, in any event.

This institution was erected in 1912 of wooden construction and then brick veneered in 1922. It is crowded and good fire escape facilities should be supplied. This is not the first time this has been reported, and I repeat it now when you are considering the erection of an addition, - a very good time to fix up the escapes.

" On a recent inspection at Crowfoot School, the Principal and Sister Superior showed me the need of a large table in the Sisters dining room, and also the need of longer tables in the children's dining room. The Staff of Sisters is nearly double the original number and the same is true of the pupils.

" At the moment, we should look after the Sisters; They put up with every form of inconvenience and overcrowding. To build a proper sized table, labour and material will cost \$30.00 and I ask for authority to get it. The present table used by the Sisters would be moved to the children's dining room and used pro tem.

" Since there has been a wired enquiry about the proposed addition to this school in October, it may still materialize and if it does, that will be the time to look after the children's tables, don't you think?"

I would recommend that the request be granted.

Indian Affairs Branch.

In addition to funds transferred to this Branch from the Indian Affairs Branch with Treasury Board approval, certain other funds are transferred from time to time in the form of cheques to the Receiver General and which cover additional engineering work that may be required by the Indian Affairs Branch.

As this Branch assumes full responsibility for the expenditure of such money, it is the opinion that all funds transferred from the Indian Affairs Branch should be regularly transferred with the approval of Treasury Board in the same way as the main funds are transferred at the beginning of each fiscal year. This procedure would seem to simplify accounting work and at the same time conforms to the arrangement approved at the time reorganization was effected.

I do not know to just what extent, if any, this arrangement can be made to cover funds that have already been made available to this branch by the issue of cheques, but I would be very glad if you could make such arrangements as may be necessary to have all future transfers approved by the usual Treasury Board Minute.

Would you kindly advise me in this respect.



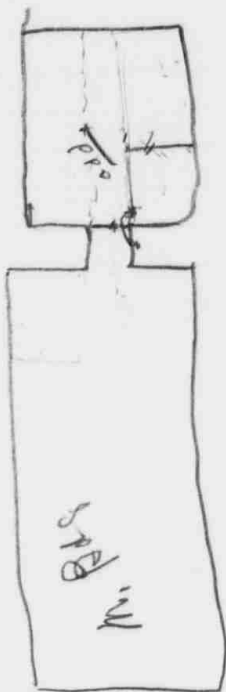

With reference to my telephone conversation with you this afternoon, I may say that Mr. George H. Gooderham, the Indian Agent of the Blackfoot Reserve, is in Ottawa at the present time and has strongly recommended certain changes in the basement of the new addition to the Crowfoot Indian Residential School.

Present plans call for a classroom on the south side of the basement. It is recommended that this be divided into two rooms with partition between them - one room to be utilized as a dairy with outside entrance, and the other as a lavatory.

These changes have already been discussed by the Principal with Mr. Snelson and the contractor, but of course, they will require confirmation from you before making any change in the original plan.

In order that this work will not be delayed, I would appreciate very much if you would wire your engineers and authorize the changes mentioned above, on the understanding that the total cost will not exceed \$250.00. The actual cost of the changes may exceed this amount, but there will be a saving in the elimination of flooring, wainscoting and plastering, provided for the south classroom in the original plans.

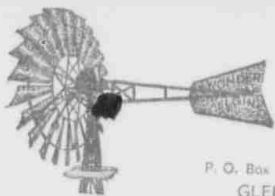

Dear sir:

I have received your circular re: Fire Prevention and Fire escapes.

Though the matter has been reported many times to the Department in the last few years, I again take the liberty of accepting your invitation to make some remarks.

We have a night watchman, who patrols the house regularly; our fire extinguishers are in order but our system of fire escapes is very precarious. We have a fire escape at each end of the building. These are windows, leading unto platforms outside with an iron pole leading to the ground. This iron pole rests in a base of concrete which is raised a few inches above the level of the ground.

We are unable however to make regular drills. Every time a drill has taken place, some one has been injured. So far in the last few years three members of the staff had to receive treatment in hospital. And last year, the girls' matron broke her heel. Since then, the children are so nervous about drills that the only thing we can do is to practise them to get in line and be prepared to go down.

After last year's accident a report was made by the agent, but the Department reported lack of funds for a suitable system of fire escape. The only thing granted was to change the windows into doors. It is therefore my duty again to report this deficiency in our system of fire escape and hope that something will finally be done about it.


Dear Sir:

With reference to the circular recently issued regarding fire prevention at Residential Schools the Principal of the Crowfoot Indian Residential School has written me along the same lines as your letter of November 16, 1937.


As you were previously informed there are no funds available at the present time for a new fire escape. It is considered, however, that until such time as funds are available for the erection of a new fire escape it should be possible to place some padding at the bottom of the pole which would at least eliminate serious injury to anyone using the fire escape.

I note from the Principal's letter that the instructions contained in the last paragraph of my letter of November 30 have been carried out. In reviewing your letter of November 16 I note that anybody using the fire escape has to climb over a bed to the window sill. You should arrange with the Principal that no bed should be near the window sill where the fire escape is located. There should be easy access to the fire escape.

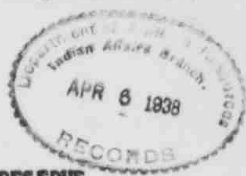



Our Chief Engineer, Mr. Mills, advises me that the above building has now been completed, with the exception of interior painting and decorating to the value of \$90.00. As you know, this work was cancelled insofar as the contract was concerned in order that the latter could be closed out on March 31st last and all payments made from funds available in the past fiscal year.

However, the contractor has forwarded a signed undertaking to carry out the unfinished work for the sum of \$90.00 when instructed by the Department to do so. Our Engineer in charge of this work states that the contractor has done an excellent piece of work.

It does not appear that we will have other construction work in the neighbourhood of Cluny this season and it seems advisable for your Indian Agent at the Blackfoot Reserve to supervise the completion of the interior painting and decorating and that accounts for the amount involved, namely \$90.00, be paid directly by your Branch. Will you kindly advise me if this arrangement is satisfactory to you. If so, we will instruct our Supervising Engineer at Banff to give the Indian Agent all details in regard to the uncompleted work.

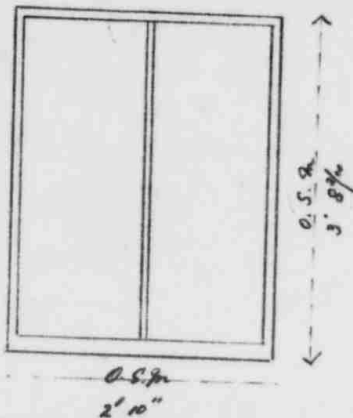

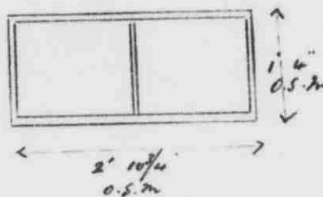

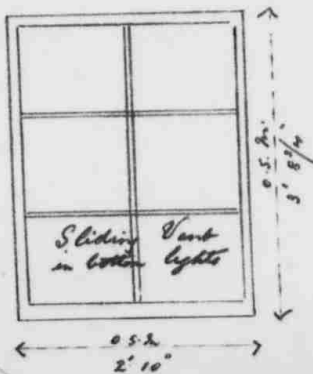
Diagram of meeting sash

Mr Holmes, through the Crown Lumber Co got competitive prices for this mill work and we are advised that the price is on the same low basis as if these extras had been included in his original tender for the building. We would gain nothing by purchasing and paying him for the labour. You will realize, I am sure, that screens and storm windows are necessary; at this time, of course, the most urgent need is screening.


The addition to the Crowfoot Residential School is complete except for storm windows and plumbing which the Principal wants installed and moved from the main building. There is also a request that certain plumbing changes be made in the main building.

The Local Plumber was asked to submit a quotation on this work. To install two baths, four basins, four closet combinations, one urinal trough 4' with flush pipe, one apron sink 42" cast (in dairy), build one partition and taking up floors and repairing same in the addition; moving bath and supplying new closet combination for Sisters' bath room adjacent to the room they propose to use for a dormitory and doing all repairing and supplying all necessary fittings, he asks the sum of \$384.00.

To make the necessary changes in the dormitories as the removal of a wall; ~~removing~~ making a door and putting a partition in the Sisters' dormitory, it is estimated that the cost will exceed \$200.00.

The total cost of the changes, including the plumbing will then be in the neighbourhood of \$600.00 and this does not include the storm windows for the addition. The plumbing changes are necessary and so is most of the work if this school with its new addition is to overcome the overcrowded condition. Please instruct us in this as the work should be done during the summer holidays.


I am in receipt of your letter of the 1st instant with reference to the Crowfoot Residential School.

In our current year's appropriation the amount of \$750.00 was provided for repairs, improvements and new equipment at this school. We have already expended \$22.90 for rebuilding the chimney and \$90.00 for painting, or a total of \$112.90. This leaves a balance of \$637.10 and it will, therefore, be possible to favourably consider the recommendations made by you in the second and third paragraphs of your recent letter.

However, before authorizing you to proceed with the work I would appreciate your advising the name and address of the "local plumber" from whom you have obtained a quotation. I presume that his quotation of \$384.00 includes both material and labour.

In connection with the changes to the dormitories I think you mentioned this when you were in the Department last winter and I am under the impression that your estimate of \$200.00 refers to material only. In that event, or even in the event of the material costing more than \$50.00, it will be necessary for you to supply full particulars regarding what is required in order that purchase may be made through our Purchasing Branch.

Dear Sir:-

Upon receipt of yours of June 7th file 104-2-5 I got in touch with the Acting Principal of the school, Revd. Father Lessard. When it was known that only \$837.10 was now available for repairs etc. it was quite evident that all could not be done that should be done unless labour costs were reduced materially. So Father Lessard got busy and worked out a programme of work using cheap labour and I think you will agree that he will do more with this allowance than we've ever done in the past, if the scheme is authorized.

In the first place, he would eliminate all high-priced mechanical labour by using a handy man whose wages are \$40.00 per month. He then went to the Crown Lumber Co. with a bill of material and ascertained the cost of lumber required. Attached hereto is a list of the work already done or to be done and the Lumber Company's quotation on material. You will note that the Crown Lumber Co submits a net price of \$488.00 which leaves \$174.00 to pay for everything else. The Revd. Father asks for necessary hardware and paint which he estimates at \$75.00 and an allowance of \$90.00 to assist in paying for the labour. This will bring the cost to slightly more than the allowance for this school but I trust this may be authorized.

The Crown Lumber Co in Gleichen is the only firm in these parts and is on the Patronage List. Hardware should not exceed \$50.00 and can be purchased locally from firms on the list; likewise paint. In regard to the labour, would it be possible to allow the Principal \$30.00 per month for the months of June, July & August for a mechanic, by submission of a Voucher through this office as is done in the case of the Night Watchman?





AGENT'S REPORT ON BLACKFOOT AGENCY FOR MONTH OF AUGUST 1938.

Schools

The writer visited both residential schools in connection with repairs and improvements. The children, of course, were still on holidays and did not return until the sixth of July. The improvement and repair work to the Crowfoot school was being carried out with local labor and the acting Principal is to be commended on the class of work and the amount that he was able to do with very limited expenditure. This school was in good shape to properly care for all the pupils this year. The crop at this school was excellent and is now being threshed. At the Old Sun School the staff was concentrating on the harvesting which came off irrigated lands. This land has produced abundance of feed and a good garden as well as some threshed grain. Both schools had done well with their exhibits at the Calgary Fair and prize money was here for the pupils on their return this fall. This coming year more stress will be given to handicraft work and the general work will undoubtedly be more pleasing to the Indian pupils.

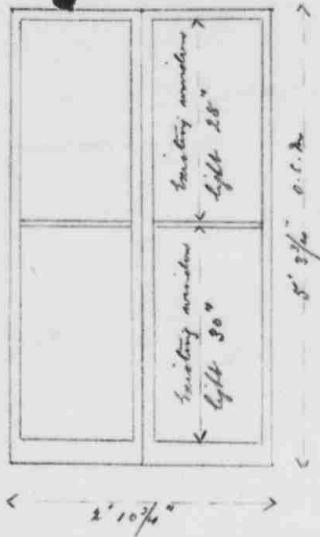

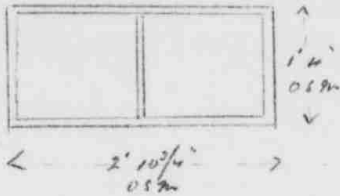

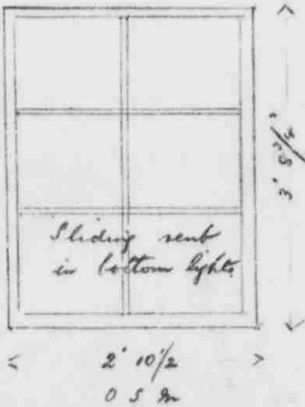
Diagram of meeting sash.

The addition to the Crowfoot Residential School is complete except for storm windows and plumbing which the Principal wants installed and moved from the main building. There is also a request that certain plumbing changes be made in the main building.

The Local Plumber was asked to submit a quotation on this work. To install two baths, four basins, four closet combinations, one urinal trough 4' with flush pipe, one apron sink 42" cast (in dairy), build one partition and taking up floors and repairing same in the addition; moving bath and supplying new closet combination for Sisters' bath room adjacent to the room they propose to use for a dormitory and doing all repairing and supplying all necessary fittings, he asks the sum of \$384.00.

To make the necessary changes in the dormitories as, the removal of a wall; ~~removing~~ making a door and putting a partition in the Sisters' dormitory, it is estimated that the cost will exceed \$200.00.

The total cost of the changes, including the plumbing will then be in the neighbourhood of \$600.00 and this does not include the storm windows for the addition. The plumbing changes are necessary and so is most of the work if this school with its new addition is to overcome the overcrowded condition. Please instruct us in this as the work should be done during the summer holidays.

In our current year's appropriation the amount of \$750.00 was provided for repairs, improvements and new equipment at this school. We have already expended \$22.90 for rebuilding the chimney and \$90.00 for painting, or a total of \$112.90. This leaves a balance of \$637.10 and it will, therefore, be possible to favourably consider the recommendations made by you in the second and third paragraphs of your recent letter.

However, before authorizing you to proceed with the work I would appreciate your advising the name and address of the "local plumber" from whom you have obtained a quotation. I presume that his quotation of \$384.00 includes both material and labour.

Dear Sir:-

Upon receipt of yours of June 7th file 104-2-5 I got in touch with the Acting Principal of the school, Revd. Father Lessard. When it was known that only \$637.10 was now available for repairs etc. it was quite evident that all could not be done that should be done unless labour costs were reduced materially. So Father Lessard got busy and worked out a programme of work using cheap labour and I think you will agree that he will do more with this allowance than we've ever done in the past, if the scheme is authorized.

In the first place, he would eliminate all high-priced mechanical labour by using a handy man whose wages are \$40.00 per month. He then went to the Crown Lumber Co. with a bill of material and ascertained the cost of lumber required. Attached hereto is a list of the work already done or to be done and the Lumber Company's quotation on material. You will note that the Crown Lumber Co submits a net price of \$486.00 which leaves \$174.00 to pay for everything else. The Revd. Father asks for necessary hardware and paint which he estimates at \$75.00 and an allowance of \$90.00 to assist in paying for the labour. This will bring the cost to slightly more than the allowance for this school but I trust this may be authorized.

The Crown Lumber Co in Gleichen is the only firm in these parts and is on the Patronage List. Hardware should not exceed \$50.00 and can be purchased locally from firms on the list; likewise paint. In regard to the labour, would it be possible to allow the Principal \$30.00 per month for the months of June, July & August for a mechanic, by submission of a Voucher through this office as is done in the case of the Night Watchman?

AGENT'S REPORT ON BLACKFOOT AGENCY FOR MONTH OF AUGUST 1936.

Schools

The writer visited both residential schools in connection with repairs and improvements. The children, of course, were still on holidays and did not return until the sixth of July. The improvement and repair work to the Crowfoot school was being carried out with local labor and the acting Principal is to be commended on the class of work and the amount that he was able to do with very limited expenditure. This school was in good shape to properly care for all the pupils this year. The crop at this school was excellent and is now being threshed. At the Old Sun School the staff was concentrating on the harvesting which came off irrigated lands. This land has produced abundance of feed and a good garden as well as some threshed grain. Both schools had done well with their exhibits at the Calgary Fair and prize money was here for the pupils on their return this fall. This coming year more stress will be given to handicraft work and the general work will undoubtedly be more pleasing to the Indian pupils.

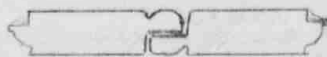
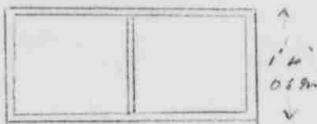


Diagram of mitered sash.




