Dear Dr. Keenleyside:

I have for reply your letter of the 28 December, 1949, being a request for our Signal Station to provide power to the Indian School at Fort Good Hope, NWT.

I am pleased to advise that we are now in a position to supply 5 KVA of electrical power to the Indian School and I understand from our local representatives that this will be adequate for your requirements. In past arrangements of this nature, your Department has usually supplied and installed the necessary line from the Signal Station power plant to your buildings and I assume that you will agree to a similar arrangement in this instance. I understand that the Signal's Warrant Officer at Fort Good Hope will arrange for his personnel to install the power lines when the materials are made available through your Department. I am sure your representatives will receive every co-operation from our Warrant Officer, who is being advised of the contents of this letter.

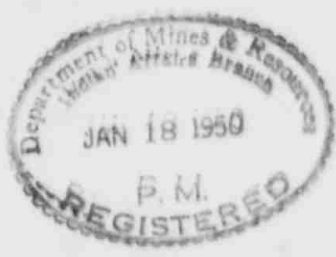



Re: Electric Power for Fort Good Hope Indian Day School

Thanks for copy of your letter of January 26, 1950, to Mr. C. R. Anderson, Chief Architect's Branch, Department of Public Works, Ottawa. I would advise you to give the matter of the transfer of the power plant from Fort Good Hope to Arctic Red River considerable study before making any definite decision. It may be that I lack knowledge of just what is involved in this transfer. Wherever this plant is transferred, you should make sure that it will be used to light up the whole settlement. You might be reimbursed from the R.C.M.P. and any others who may connect to the line. It would be a very sound policy to give the R.C.M.P. free light on the understanding that their officer would attend to the plant. Members of the R.C.M.P. are usually mechanically inclined and would be able to attend to this matter.

Before the 16½ K.V.A. plants were purchased, I advocated the purchase of small 3,500 watt plants for our use. I wasn't invited to the meeting when it was agreed that the larger units would be purchased. Therefore, I did not have any say as to what type of equipment would be provided. However, we have the large plants -- so we must be realistic about the whole matter. It seems to me that it would be much better to move the plant to Fort McPherson and have it used to light up the school, nursing station, R.C.M.P. and any others wishing light. You might be able to make some kind of arrangement whereby the personnel of the nursing station or the R.C.M.P. would look after and maintain the plant for this service. This would remove your Department from the financial responsibility of maintenance and so forth. If the Arctic Red River school is to be made into an outpost school nursing station, it might be practical to move the two small plants from the nursing station at Fort Good Hope to Arctic Red River and use them for the school and nursing station. By having two small plants at Arctic Red River, there would be a stand-by at all times. Furthermore,

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

the R.C.C.S. at Fort Good Hope purchased two 25½ K.V.A. plants on the understanding that the nursing station would connect to their power supply, so the nursing station will not require their two small plants.

Mr. Hall at Fort Norman is a well-qualified electrician. He informed me that the school at Fort Norman used 3,000 watts with everything turned on. I am inclined to the view that it would be much better to move the large plant to Fort McPherson for the use of the whole settlement and use the two small plants at Arctic Red River. I have discussed the above with Mr. Hall of Fort Norman who knows the local situation. He concurs in the above views. If it is possible to locate a small 2,500 or 3,000 watt plant to be installed along with the large unit, the situation would be clarified. The small plant could be used most of the time. It would operate at least 18 out of the 24 hours per day and result in a saving of at least \$100 per month in fuel. It would pay for itself in a few months and result in a saving of a thousand dollars or more each year.

I am submitting the above suggestions for your consideration as I am vitally interested in the complete success of our schools and in economizing wherever possible.

Dear Mr. McKinnon:

Your suggestion with regard to the R.C.M.P. seems a sound one and I would suggest that you might discuss this matter with Mr. Hunter when you next see him. Having been in the R.C.M.P., no doubt a satisfactory arrangement can be worked out locally.

I have often wondered how the electrical plants and other equipment for these two-room Day schools in the Northwest Territories were decided. I certainly was not present at any meeting and I note that you were not there either. At the present time they are proving a source of great irritation to our Indian Superintendents and teachers. I wonder if we would not be better off without any type of lighting plant but just return to the old naphtha lamp. The only one with which we have not had any difficulty is the unit at Fort Norman.

I would be very pleased if you would go into this whole matter with both Mr. Kirkby and Mr. Hunter and see whether a joint agreement cannot be reached with regard to the units at Fort Good Hope and Fort McPherson. These schools seem to have been designed on a rather complicated basis and therefore neither teachers nor other local

inhabitants can handle the electrical equipment. If they give all this trouble when they are new, I shudder to think of the correspondence, Army Messages, etc., which will flood into here when they are a few years older.

I am sending copies of this letter to both Mr. Kirkby and Mr. Hunter and I hope the three of you in the North can advise what should be done with regard to the electrical equipment and heating of the schools before work begins at Fort Franklin and Arctic Red River.


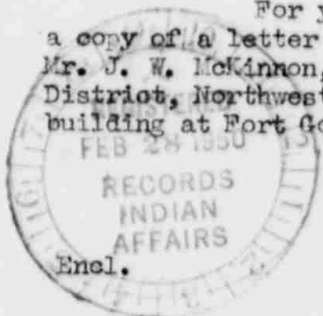

On December 17, 1949, I stopped at Fort Good Hope long enough to inspect the new school building and would report as follows:


This building is in an unfinished state. I understand the Army plans to finish this project this summer. At present, one of the classrooms is on the way to completion; the other has much interior work to be done. The woodwork has not been finished or varnished. The floors are in a rough state. The walls are to be decorated and the outside of the building is to be sheeted.

I understand that this school has been connected with the local R.C.C.S. power supply. This is a good policy in view of the fact that there is no one available to attend to the local plant and that the local R.C.C.S. Station has an abundance of power for all local buildings.

It appears that this school is being well constructed and that we should have a very fine building when the interior and exterior work is completed, the plumbing connected to some outside set-up and the building finished in every detail.

A 2,000 gallon water tank, hot water heater, and shower room should be provided as has been provided at Fort Resolution. This is essential in the interests of good sanitation and health.

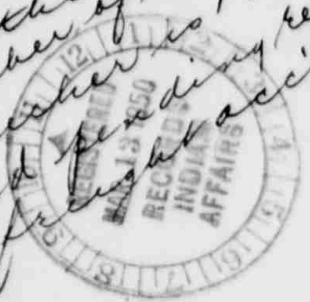

I am replying to your letter of January 25th in reference to Fort Good Hope, N.W.T., and the Indian Day School located there.

I was recently at Fort Good Hope and found that the heat had been withdrawn from the building and the caretaker dismissed. This was in accordance with arrangements made by Mr. L.C. Hunter, Superintendent of Indian Agencies, the work of withdrawing the heat having been carried out by the N.C.O., of Royal Canadian Corps of Signals and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

There is no object in sending in wire or any materials for the construction of a poleline between the Signals Station and the School during the present winter. The materials should thus go forward at opening of navigation, with the work to be carried out next summer.

A spare copy of this letter is attached for the attention of Col. B.F. Neary, Department of Education, Indian Affairs Branch.

Fort Good Hope Indian Day School


I gathered from recent correspondence with Mr. Gooderham that Dr. Falconer has written to you requesting a combined school and nursing station at Fort Good Hope. This school is now finished having been erected as a two-room school on the recommendation of Mr. J.W. McKinnon, Inspector of Schools. Mr. Gooderham has recommended the conversion of this building as a combined school and nursing station. He has suggested that a solid partition be placed between the two classrooms. One of the classrooms could be sub-divided by partitions to serve as a nursing station.

The apartment upstairs would be sub-divided to be available as two separate suites.

If your architect wishes to have a copy of the plans for this Fort Good Hope school he can obtain one by calling Mr. Buck at 7952.

As this school is now completed with a few minor details to be attended to, the expense of the alterations would have to be borne by Indian Health Services.



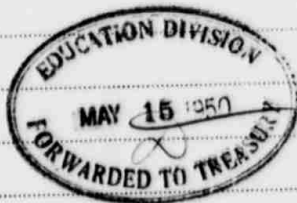
